"Not Even Once" is the message Governor Butch Otter is hoping to get out with the Idaho Meth Project.

Thursday night, the governor met with leaders from across Idaho about the methamphetamine problem in the Gem State.

Idaho is actually ranked 5th in the nation for meth use. With the new campaign, the state hopes to dramatically change that.

The meth campaign comes on the heels of one already up and running in Montana. That campaign was completely funded on private donations, and our governor is fighting to do the same here.

Just a warning: some of the videos and ads are graphic.

The commercials running in Montana are credited with dramatically curbing meth use in their state.

Graphic is the priority, educating youth and adults alike about the devastating effects meth can have on your body.

The chemicals in the deadly drug literally rot your body from the inside out -- addicts often lose hair, age prematurely and loose teeth slowly killing you.

The pictures are just the beginning. Thursday night's dinner will showcase meth survivors who've lived to tell the tale of their terrible addictions.

"I did so much that my eyes would rattle in my head," recalls Donna Huebner, recovering meth addict, "and I had seizures from it. It's the best thing in my life. Nobody's going to take it away. Take my kids; whatever, but don't take my dope."
